dents and staff.

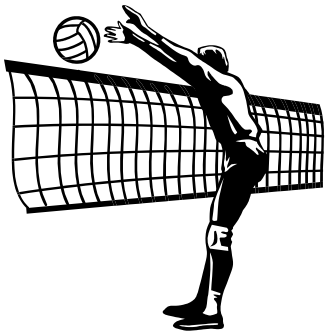
Q: What don't you like about being a principal?

Bake Mini Carrot Cakes as a Tasty Treat on Halloween

Ingredients.:

(2-layer size) carrot cake mix
 1 pkg. (4-serving size) Jell-O Vanilla Instant Pudding
 1 tub (250 g) Philadelphia Cream Cheese Spread
 2 Tbsp. sugar
 2-3/4 cups thawed Cool Whip Whipped Topping
 2 cups chopped walnuts

Make It

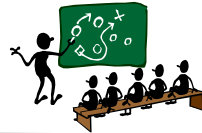
HEAT oven to 350 °F.
 PREPARE cake batter as directed on package, adding dry pudding mix. Spoon into 48 paper-lined mini muffin pan cups.
 BAKE 12 to 15 min. or until toothpick inserted in centers comes out clean. Cool in pans 10 min.; remove to wire racks. Cool completely.
 REMOVE cupcakes from liners; cut cupcakes horizontally in half. Mix cream cheese spread and sugar in large bowl until blended; stir in Cool Whip.
 FILL each cupcake with 1 Tbsp. cream cheese mixture. Frost with remaining cream cheese mixture; sprinkle with nuts.
